ACHS commences General Practice accreditation

The Australian Council on Healthcare Standards (ACHS) is pleased to announce that for the first time it will be offering accreditation services to general practices through its new program **AAGP (ACHS Accreditation for General Practices)**. This program will commence in October to the new RACGP Standards for General Practice 5th edition and offers the expertise of Australia's longest-running healthcare accreditation organisation.

ACHS will launch the new program at the Royal Australian College of General Practitioner's annual conference to be held in Sydney on October 27, at the new Sydney Convention Centre.

In the lead up to the launch of the program ACHS has opened an **Expressions of Interest** register to determine the future scope of interest from general practices that may wish to change their existing accreditation provider and those considering undertaking accreditation for the first time.
